Translate the information into a table, chart, graph, or other visual representation. Cite specific textual evidence to support the analysis.

- 2. Investigate the costs of childbirth in the following countries: United States, Canada, Mexico, France, and Japan. Research both vaginal/natural childbirth and caesarian section, then create a GRAPH or CHART comparing each country with the different costs.
- Natural/Vaginal Birth (no epidural)Total Cost: hospital stay, OB/GYN fees
- C-Section- Delivery Total cost: anesthesia, hospital stay, OB/GYN fees
- 3. Your graph/chart must have a title, labeled X and Y axis, all information labeled (country and costs). It's up to you how you design this. It can be a bar graph, circle graph, dot chart, comparison chart, etc.
